This year we are looking to venture further afield, and we are on the verge of going into a major school in the Canterbury area. This is very exciting for us as a charity, and it goes alongside what the Lord has been showing us in prayer recently. We can also see God's timing in it, as one of the main schools we go into has changed from a PRU (Pupil Referral Unit) to a satellite of the Goldwyn School, which may change our working relationship with them.

Lately we have been receiving parental referrals, which happen as parents of an old student tell another parent in need of help about how we were able to help their child. #### Searching For Hope (Refugees in Calais)

The refugees in Calais are searching for hope, and our mission is to go and take hope to them – the gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ, and much needed food and clothing to these people who have nowhere to live.

The numbers of refugees in Calais is increasing, and we have been told that there are now about 2,000 that are known about, but in reality the figure may be much higher. As wars and trouble increases in the Middle East the numbers of refugees are becoming numerous across Europe.

Our most recent visits to Calais were on the 6th September 2014 and the 13th September 2014. On the 6th September, we met up with Dominic, who is an English man living there who has helped us make inroads with the locals and with the refugees over the years. He took us to a place where the men are camping on the outskirts of Calais. When we arrived at the camp we gave out

bread, fruit, cheese, Christian tracts and Bibles. The refugees are being given one meal a day, which of course is not enough! It was a shocking scene to see men that we are talking to who are homeless, stateless and almost starving, with all hope daily ebbing away. Most of the men we spoke to were from Sudan and are Muslims.



On 13th
September, we arrived at the
Port of Dover and made up 40-50
bags of food with bread, cheese and fruit, ready to give out to the refugees. We planned to hand these bags out as the refugees left the building where clothes



are distributed to them, and to give out Christian literature, but found that the clothing centre was closed. There were lots of refugees around on the street, and some asked if we had food, so we decided to distribute it there and got the bags out. Within minutes a big crowd surged round the corner and pushed forward to grab food parcels. These were desperate people!! We gave out lots of literature and prayed for some people. There was a Syrian man and his 10 year old son, and lots of Sudanese and Eritreans.

One evening, as the team met together to pray for the upcoming trip, we could see a huge combine harvester through the window, working to harvest the field, and it reminded us of the urgency of bringing the harvest in at the right time of the year. It was getting dark as we talked and prayed, and in the field the combine-harvesters' headlights seemed to be getting extremely bright - it reminded us of how Christians will be a blazing light in these days and that the Lord will draw more and more lost souls to Himself as the world becomes darker.

If you are interested in joining the team that visit Calais on a Saturday, please contact me. We also need warm clothes for men and blankets, tins of food with ring pull tops, and supermarket carrier bags. And remember to pray for the refugees in Calais, and for us as we go to share hope with them.
